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KNO NEWS LOGLINE

A news crew staffed with psychopaths and idiots bring their audiences the latest breaking "news". However, when they run out of news, they're forced to try and make more.

KNO NEWS PROPOSAL

Kno Knews is a 24 minute satirical news show, which follows psychopathic news anchor Vance McTaggart as he delivers the latest breaking "news", on location reports from his staff and trainwreck interviews with politicians. It is the news in its final, apocalyptic form. With the popularity of shows like Adult Swim's The Eric Andre Show and BBC 2's Have I Got News For You, one can see that there is an audience for shows which satirise and deconstruct the news. Kno Knews takes this a step further, deconstructing and poking fun at the medium millions use to receive their news; the television news broadcast. With outrageous headlines, a push for high content turnover and the creation of news by the journalists themselves, Kno Knews will provide audiences with a hilariously catastrophic vision of the future of news. The cast of ostentatious characters is headed up by Vance McTaggart. Media trained since birth, he was born to read the news. However, years of commercial news casting have broken him.Vance prioritises sound bites, outrage and a machine gun approach to news delivery. Vance's right hand man is sports correspondent Zachary O'Riordan. A man who only has vague notions as to what sport is, Zachary was handed the job through his uncle. Rounding out the cast are the morally bankrupt reporter on location Kairi O'Callaghan Walsh, the oblivious business correspondent Thea Griffith and a gaggle of Teactaí Dála from Fine Gael, Fianna Fail, Sinn Fein and the Green Party. The show begins with Vance McTaggart calling out the headlines, complete with clips taken out of context for comedic purposes. After an obnoxious opening Vance welcomes us to the show. The show's content can be broken down into three distinct categories; reports from the field, interviews with politicians in the studio, and correspondents' reports in the studio. The reports from the field begin as odd, dystopian inquiries. The very first report is a look into new government plans to reduce homelessness, while the second report deals with new figures on discrimination in hiring practices. However, as the show progresses and Vance runs out of news, Kairi O'Callaghan Walsh is forced to take matters into her own hands to make more news The interviews with the politicians are used to get responses on the field reports shown; to various degrees of civility. Running gags include Vance being pally with the Fine Gael TD, the Fianna Fail TD's struggle to

differentiate himself from his blueshirt rival, the Sinn Fein TD being accused of terrorism and other war crimes, and the Green Party TD being a puppet of other forces. The correspondents reports in the studio cover Zachary O'Riordan's failing attempts to convince Vance, and the audience, that he is an expert through his sports reports and Thea Griffith's simplistic look at the stock market. The current plan is to shoot in January 2021, both on location in Dublin City and in the National Film School. Producer and writer Ruairí Coughlan is an award winning filmmaker, with his previous works winning best student drama at the Royal Television Society. From West Cork and based in Dublin, Ruairí brings a youthful energy and humour to projects, which he hopes to continue with Kno Knews.

VANCE MCTAGGART (V.O) Michael Martin spills the beans on orgy invites.

MICHAEL MARTIN Well I could go through the likes of Seamus Brennan, Dermot Ahern, Bertie Ahern himself, others.

EXT. DAIL - NIGHT

A clip plays of a Leo Varadkar speech.

VANCE MCTAGGART (V.O) Leo Varadkar briefs the press on his working relationship with Green Party's Eamon Ryan.

LEO VARADKAR I know for me the worst part has been the daily text message I recieve around five o'clock every evening. I yearn for the day when it stops.

INT. JAIL - DAY

A clip from a Robert Pattinson press tour.

VANCE MCTAGGART (V.O) Robert Pattinson returns to jail cell on press tour for the Twilight prequel film.

NEWS REPORTER Did you spend much time in there? Yes.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE slams down cue cards. Sheets of paper fly.

VANCE MCTAGGART It's time to get fact.

CUT IN TITLES

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE looks up from the sheets of paper.

VANCE MCTAGGART Good evening. I'm Vance McTaggart, this is the news.

Vance turns to another camera.

VANCE MCTAGGART Homes, if you haven't got one you're homeless. With ever increasing numbers of people becoming homeless the government have faced pressure to bring those numbers down. With a new plan to tackle homelessness being published this week, reporter Kairi O'Callaghan-Walsh brings us the inside scoop.

EXT. DAIL - DAY

KAIRI stands in front of Leinster House.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Homes, if you haven't got one, you're homeless. This is a fact the new minister for public deficits and extramarital affairs Devon Prendergast has been grappling with for days now. INT. OFFICE - DAY

DEVON PRENDERGAST sits at his desk in front of his computer. His fingers hover over a keyboard. The computer is turned off.

> DEVON PRENDERGAST You know, you don't really think it's an issue until it effects you personally, like for me when someone showed me a report on my first day and said "stop this", you know?

EXT. STREET, D2 - DAY

KAIRI walks up to the camera.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Despite suggestions from opposition parties, Mr Prendergast has come up with a new, innovative solution.

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

Superimposed: RECREATION

DEVON sits alone in a sitting room. He watches a television playing static snow. Sitting next to him is a teddy bear.

DEVON PRENDERGAST (V.O) Well, I was watching the hit 2005 animation Robots, with my son Tyrion. And I saw the scene with the big robot sweepers, when they gather up the old robots and take them to the chop shop. And I thought, this is a policy that could be implemented here.

EXT. STREET, D2 - DAY

KAIRI steps into the frame.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH When I asked about the possibility of seeing giant robots sweeping up the homeless soon, Mr Prendergast was cautious to raise hopes. INT. OFFICE - DAY

Devon looks up from his computer. There's gunshots in the background.

DEVON PRENDERGAST Unfortunately due to budget 2021 restrictions, we won't be seeing sweepers any time soon. But, as you can probably hear, we are going through trials of other alternatives.

Beat.

DEVON PRENDERGAST Really, it's all about reducing homelessness, one person at a time.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE takes off one of two pairs of glasses.

VANCE MCTAGGART Fascinating. Now joining me via video link are Fine Gael TD Malachy McTiernan and Fianna Fail TD Padraig Paine. Good evening gentlemen.

MALACHY and PADRAIG appear on screen.

MALACHY MCTIERNAN Thanks for having me on bud.

Vance shoots finger guns at him.

VANCE MCTAGGART

Aces.

PADRAIG PAINE Ah, yes, thank you Mr Mc-

VANCE MCTAGGART Alright, calm down. Now. The public have noticed a certain level of tension between the parties in government. Are there internal conflicts within the coalition.

MALACHY MCTIERNAN

There are no...ah... tensions. There's always going to be miscommunication. Mistimed statements, conflicting reports, incitement to violence, death threats; these are all part and parcel of any coalition.

VANCE MCTAGGART

Mr Paine, some would point out that as two very similar political parties, it makes little sense to have conflict.

PADRAIG PAINE

Well, I take issue with that assertion Vance. Fianna Fail has a long history of innovation and an approach to politics which is uniquely our own.

VANCE MCTAGGART

Like what?

Padraig does a double take.

PADRAIG PAINE

Excuse me?

VANCE MCTAGGART

Well, what would be an example of Fianna Fail's unique approach to politics?

Padraig stares blankly.

PADRAIG PAINE

Well.

Beat.

PADRAIG PAINE Well, we wear these green ties, where as Fine Gael wear blue ties.

Vance looks at another camera.

VANCE MCTAGGART It's time for the sports news. Zachary, give us some facts. INT. SPORTS DESK, STUDIO - EVENING

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN, sweating buckets, sits at the sports desk.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Thanks Vance. Professional wrestling, is it a sport? I'm not sure, but ESPN says yes. With his latest match scheduled for the end of the month, I caught up with LJ Cleary to check in on the latest developments on the Irish scene.

INT. STADIUM - DAY

LJ Cleary sits in the stands.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN (V.O) If you know anything about professional wrestling, you might just know who this is.

Zachary stands in front of LJ Cleary.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Sorry, what's your name?

LJ CLEARY LJ. LJ Cleary. Isn't that something you should know?

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Would you rather be punched or kicked?

LJ CLEARY

Sorry?

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Would you rather be punched or kicked?

LJ CLEARY Ah...probably punched.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Who would win in a fight, Hulk Hogan or Macho Man Randy Savage?

JAMIE HEASLIP Well, ah, Hulk Hogan is retired now. ZACHARY O'RIORDAN That's not answering the question.

LJ CLEARY I'm pretty sure Macho Man passed away around 2011, God rest him.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN You're dodging the question.

LJ CLEARY (Beat) Hulk Hogan, I guess.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN When you're heading into a match, were you always hoping for a win?

LJ CLEARY (Beat) As opposed to what?

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN You tell me, you're the professional wrestling expert here.

LJ CLEARY Yes. Yes, I always hope I win. Are you going to ask me anything about the match at the end of the month?

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Professional wrestling, let's be honest here is it a real sport? Because I have a lot of testimonials from very real people on the internet who say otherwise.

LJ stares at Zachary.

EXT. STADIUM - DAY

ZACHARY staggers out of the building. His face is bruised. He walks up to the camera, limping.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN I think it's safe to say, Mr Cleary is just as fiery intellectually as he is in the ring. Back to you Zachary. INT. SPORTS DESK, STUDIO - EVENING

ZACHARY looks over to VANCE.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Back to you Vance.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE looks up from a sheet.

VANCE MCTAGGART Discrimination in the workplace. A scourge of the past, no more. With an increasing number of stories of workplace discrimination coming to the light, Kairi O'Callaghan-Walsh went out to figure out what the suss is.

EXT. PARK - DAY

KAIRI walks through a park.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Workplace discrimination; made illegal in 2008, one would think that would be that. But many have come forward since then to raise the alarm on its continued existence.

FAITH sits on a bench.

FAITH I find it difficult to get hired, y'know. If I send a CV out with my name on it, Faith Usman, I don't get a call back.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH (V.O) Faith Usman, a woman of colour, tells me about the latest transgression.

FAITH But this one time, I sent my CV but changed my name on it to Sarah Moloney, and I got a call back. EXT. ATTICUS IRELAND - DAY

KAIRI stands outside an office building owned by Atticus Ireland Ltd.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH The company in question, Atticus Ireland, has had multiple other women and people of colour blow the whistle on workplace discrimination and harrasment.

EXT. PARK - DAY

ANNIE sits on a bench.

Superimpose: Annie Burke - Woman at Atticus Ireland

ANNIE

There's men I work with, who earn seven euros an hour more than me. We've same job, been there an equal amount of time. I raised this with my employer Moses Whelan and he just kind of ignored me while I stood in his office. This went on for hours.

FAITH sits on another bench.

FAITH Guys will wolf whistle at me in the office.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Are you sure they're not just whistling?

INT. CORRIDOR, ATTICUS IRELAND - DAY

Kairi stands in a corridor.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH We spoke with Moses Whelan to get his side of the story. INT. FOYER, ATTICUS IRELAND - DAY

KAIRI stands in front of MOSES.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Mr Whelan, do you discriminate against people of colour and women in your company?

MOSES WHELAN

No.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Thank you.

EXT. ATTICUS IRELAND - DAY

KAIRI stands with ULTAN GREENE outside the office.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH (V.O) Ultan Greene, a close personal friend of Moses Whelan came to his defence in an exclusive interview with me.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Has he ever discriminated against you?

Ultan shakes his head.

ULTAN

Never. Not once. He's always been incredibly nice to me. Never felt bullied or harassed, and I'm sure that even if I were employed by Moses, that would never happen to me.

EXT. PARKING LOT, ATTICUS IRELAND - DAY

KAIRI walks away from Atticus Ireland. Behind her we see MOSES berating ANNIE and FAITH.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH That's all well and good but what do the cold, hard facts say? Well a study conducted by our very own broadcaster has made a startling discovery. Up to 80% of women and people of colour say that they've experienced discrimination in the workplace. However, when the same number of white men were asked, the number falls to less than 5%. So, does workplace discrimination still exist? The juries out on this one. Kairi O'Callaghan-Walsh, Atticus Ireland.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE exhales.

VANCE MCTAGGART We'll be back after this break.

We fade into black, then immediately fade back up.

Vance swivels in his chair and stares down the barrel of the camera.

VANCE MCTAGGART

Are you a sane person. If so you're probably a fan of the news. You've probably asked yourself; how can I watch more news. Well with The News+ you can. For 14.99 a month you get access to a library of past episodes. You can watch the news on demand, watch the six o'clock news at one, watch the three o'clock news at nine. The possibilities are endless. Go to thenews+.com and sign up now. Now!

EXT. HILL IN THE COUNTRYSIDE, GERMANY - DAY

ALICE ACKERMANN, a researcher, and BRUNA BRETSCHNEIDER, a singer, stand on top of a hill.

Alice holds an open folder.

PRESENTER (V.O) On this week's Who Do You Think You Are: Germany, singer Bruna BRETSCHNEIDER retraces her family's footsteps. ALICE ACKERMANN Unfortunately we discovered that your great grandfather was, in fact, a nazi.

Bruna recoils in shock.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE slams his fist into the table.

VANCE MCTAGGART Joining us now through video link is Sinn Fein TD, Muirne Ní Mhuirtigh Suilleabhain.

Muirne appears on a screen.

MUIRNE Good evening Vance.

VANCE MCTAGGART Well. Come on then.

MUIRNE

Sorry?

VANCE MCTAGGART Will you come out and admit that you are a terrorist?

MUIRNE I... this is outrageous. I came on here to discuss our failing health system.

VANCE MCTAGGART Am I making you angry, are you triggered, are you going to kill me?

MUIRNE No, this is utterly ridiculous, Sinn Fein-

VANCE MCTAGGART -Say it. Say you kill poor innocent people.

MUIRNE

I never see you take Fianna Fail or Fine Gael TDs to task over atrocities carried out during the Civil War, or the War for Independence!

Vance pauses.

VANCE MCTAGGART That's different, that was good terrorism!

Vance swivels back around to the main camera.

MUIRNE (O.S.)

Excuse m-

VANCE MCTAGGART Shut up. Sports now!

INT. SPORTS DESK, STUDIO - EVENING

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN coughs in shock, half way through a vape.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN

Huh?

VANCE MCTAGGART (O.S) Sports now!

Zachary looks through his single sheet of copy.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN I... Sorry... Um. I think I'm out Vance.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE glares towards ZACHARY.

VANCE MCTAGGART And now, business with Thea Griffith.

INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

THEA GRIFFITH beams as she stands beside a graph of the stock exchange. She points to it.

THEA GRIFFITH As you can see Vance, the line went down but now it's gone up. That's really good.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

Vance sweats profusely as he stares off camera.

VANCE MCTAGGART What do you mean we've run out of news. We're the godamn news.

Vance stands up.

VANCE MCTAGGART We're the godamn news, damn it! Get onto Kairi tell her to find me some news.

There's a muffled, inaudible response off camera.

VANCE MCTAGGART I don't care what she does, we need news. Zachary too.

Vance wipes his brow. There's another muffled, in audible response. He straightens his tie and clears his throat.

VANCE MCTAGGART Ok. Now, via video link technology we have Green Party TD Dymphna Duffy, to talk more about the government's new plan to tackle homelessness

DYMPHNA DUFFY appears on screen. ZACHARY is seen walking past Vance.

DYMPHNA DUFFY Good evening Vance.

VANCE MCTAGGART Mr Duffy, how has your party reacted to these new measures?

DYMPHNA DUFFY

Well-

Theres voices off screen on Dymphna's end. Dymphna looks off screen. He takes a sheet of paper from off screen, which he reads from.

DYMPHNA DUFFY

The Green Party fully supports this, and all government measures. Reducing homelessness is in fact, a very progressive policy, so of course it speaks deeply to all Green Party TDs-

Vance looks behind the camera and nods.

VANCE MCTAGGART Ok, we have to leave it there Mr Duffy. It's time for an update on business news. Thea?

INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

THEA beams.

THEA GRIFFITH Thanks Vance-

VANCE MCTAGGART (O.S) Nice dress by the way.

Thea does a double take

THEA GRIFFITH Thanks Vance. Business news now, apparently. The banks are all looking steady, with Bank of The Pale having good quarterly results. An update to an existing agreement with the Irish Associates Bank and the Bank of Irish Associates are set to begin new rounds of loans being traded between the two institutions. Observers will have a keen eye on some of the more high profile transfers-

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE MCTAGGART Do you have a favourite bank? INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

THEA GRIFFITH Sorry? Uh, well... I dunno. Bank of Ireland?

VANCE MCTAGGART (O.S) Oh really? That's my favourite too.

THEA nods politely and turns back to her camera.

THEA GRIFFITH But despite those possible shakeups, all seems stable.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE MCTAGGART Seems stable. Seems.

INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

THEA GRIFFITH From what I can see, yes.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE MCTAGGART But you can't be 100% certain. The whole system could collapse at a moment's notice.

He snaps his finger.

VANCE MCTAGGART (CONT'D) Like that.

INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

THEA GRIFFITH Well Vance, from what experts are saying, that appears to be incredibly unlikely. INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE MCTAGGART I think the people of Ireland have had enough of these so called "experts".

THEA GRIFFITH (O.S)

I-

VANCE MCTAGGART Are you telling me that there's a zero per cent chance that we're heading towards a total financial collapse?

INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

THEA GRIFFITH Well, no, it's always possible-

VANCE MCTAGGART (O.S) Sorry Thea, I'm going to have to stop you there.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE looks back down the barrel of the camera.

VANCE MCTAGGART Breaking news!

A "BREAKING NEWS!" graphic flashes on screen.

VANCE MCTAGGART (CONT'D) Total, global, financial crash warning!

A "TOTAL, GLOBAL, FINANCIAL CRASH WARNING!" graphic flashes on screen.

VANCE MCTAGGART (CONT'D) Leading financial observers warn of the possibility that the fall of our financial system is imminent. One would expect this could lead to job losses, food shortages, general pandemonium. A return to the worst horrors of 2008.

Beat.

VANCE MCTAGGART And now I'm told Zachary O'Riordan is standing by with a sports report. Zachary?

EXT. FOOTBALL PITCH - EVENING

ZACHARY stands by a football pitch.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Yes Vance. I'm standing here on the hallowed ground, the football pitch. Uncountable games have been played here, many won, just as many lost. Pitches like this one have existed since time immemorial, or roughly 1830. Local sources tell me a U-16s match is to be played right here tomorrow morning. For those of you at home who aren't sports experts like myself, U16 often means Under 16.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

Vance nods.

VANCE MCTAGGART I see. And what teams are playing tomorrow, Zachary?

EXT. FOOTBALL PITCH - EVENING

Yes.

Zachary stands still, glassy eyed.

VANCE MCTAGGART (O.S) Zachary?

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Two football teams.

VANCE MCTAGGART (O.S) Two football teams?

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN

VANCE MCTAGGART (O.S) Which ones?

Zachary sways in the wind.

ZACHARY O'RIORDAN Home and away.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

Vance looks off camera and coughs.

VANCE MCTAGGART (to himself) Ok, it's up to me.

Vance swivels 360 degrees in his chair.

VANCE MCTAGGART (CONT'D) Breaking news!

A breaking news image flashes on screen.

VANCE MCTAGGART This show's head of research, Israel O'Hanley has been cheating on his wife with Thea Griffith, our business correspondent. I was personally informed of this in a private conversation with Mr O'Hanley over what he called "a pint". I'm currently reaching out to Mr O'Hanley for public comment on the matter. Thea, what's your reaction to you destroying the sacred bond between man and wife?

INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

Thea's mouth is agape.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

Vance stares across the studio.

VANCE MCTAGGART For Christ's sake Thea, say something you're the news.

INT. BUSINESS CORNER, STUDIO - EVENING

Thea sags.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

Vance looks behind one of the cameras.

VANCE MCTAGGART Oh thank God. Sorry Thea, but I'm just being told there's been a murder in the capitol. Kairi O'Callaghan-Walsh with the report!

EXT. STREET, D2 - DAY

Kairi stands in front of the camera, caked in blood.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Death on the streets of Dublin City. I received reports just moments ago that a man was killed just behind me.

Kairi stands to the side and we see a dead body, face down.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH I'm told that gardaí are on their way to the scene of the crime now. Mystery surrounds the murder weapon, but sources close to me tell me it was this knife.

Kairi holds up a bloody knife.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Who could have committed such a crime? What was their motive? These things, we may never know.

Police sirens can be heard. Kairi looks off into the distance.

KAIRI O'CALLAGHAN-WALSH Oh shit. That's all from me Vance, back to you in the studio.

Kairi turns and runs away down the street as the sirens come closer.

INT. STUDIO - EVENING

VANCE looks up from sheets of copy.

VANCE MCTAGGART And we'd just like to apologise for some of the language used in that report from our reporter at large, Kairi O'Callaghan-Walsh.

He clears his throat.

VANCE MCTAGGART That's all from us here tonight. NEXT TIME ON THE NEWS!

INT. DAIL CHAMBER - DAY

A clip of Stephen Donnelly speaking to the Dail plays.

VANCE MCTAGGART (V.O) Stephen Donnelly comes down hard on his proposed plan to ban all sports with balls greater than 2.5 inches in diameter


KNO NEWS SET DESIGN

When it comes to set design on Kno News, I'm incredibly lucky to be working with an incredibly talented production design team from the Design for Stage and Screen course. We want to try and give the set a sleek, "Death Star" like design, cleverly using darkness to try and create an ambiance on the set that can also cover costs.

We were first experimenting with using one stable set and swapping out props and furniture for each presenter when they came up in the script. However due to the live nature at the show this is not feasible. We are now looking at using three smaller, modular sets for Vance, Zachary and Thea, instead of one larger one. This could reduce build time in the studio, as well as reducing cost. It may also allow us to give the impression that the Kno News studio is larger than it actually is.








Kno News Graphics

A huge component of news broadcasts are their graphics. From the 1980s to the present day, the styles and tone of the graphics used have fluctuated and varied. In Kno News I hope to put some of these styles side by side while also using graphics for comedic effect. All graphics for the show are being produced by Zoe Boss.

The first graphic myself and Zoe need to nail down is the show's logo. We're leaning towards the modern trend of strong colours with heavy block font, as seen below for BBC News, FOX News and MSNBC News.



Another important factor in terms of graphics is the show's intro sequence. For Kno News myself and Zoe have researched many different news intro sequences throughout the years. We're currently working on an intro based on the RTE News intro from 1984-87, images from which are presented below. Our own intro would also involve explosions, wails, screams, gunfire, ambulance sirens and the like, to tie in to the high octane, morbid, apocalyptic tone of Kno News.





Something which really struck me while watching American news coverage of the 2020 Presidential Election was the frequent use CNN made of exciting graphics to announce "Key Race Alerts", as seen below. The graphic was paired with a pompous, almost orchestral stinger. However, it was very rare that these "Key Race Alerts" actually amounted to being key race

alerts. They were often just a way of keeping the audience hooked while talking about minor movements in county polls. I think it would be interesting, and funny, to lean in to these kinds of graphics. These kinds of graphics in the show, for the example the **"TOTAL, GLOBAL, FINANCIAL CRASH WARNING!**" graphic, will be used by the characters to try and aggrandize trivial statements and cover up a lack of any real news.



KNO NEWS MUSIC

News theme music is central to the experience of digesting news broadcasts. I want Kno News to have its own distinguishable theme music, which compliments the show. To this end I am working with music producer Cian Reilis to make such a theme.

It's important that the theme music carries on and exaggerates the tendency of news themes to be grandiose in nature. However, because of the frankly dystopian content of the show, I want there to be a sense of dread in the music. I imagine in the universe the show is set in, if someone were to hear the Kno News intro theme they would immediately associate it with catastrophe and hardship.

In essence? We're trying to create the *The Imperial March* of news themes.

KNO NEWS EDIT PLAN

In terms of an edit plan, Kno News doesn't require much of one. The show will be shot as live, with some recordings being done without any breaks and others being recorded as live in segments in between VTs.

In the latter case an edit will have to be carried out in order to assemble the different segments of the show together.

KNO NEWS DISTRIBUTION AND MARKETING PLAN

When it comes to distribution, I see Kno News being a post-watershed comedy stable on the likes of Channel 4 or Adult Swim. Those channels have comedy shows in the same biting, youthful vein as Kno News, so there's an established audience there, which I'd be aiming to hit, the key demo of 18-34 year olds, with the possibility of expanding that demographic to 18-49 year olds.

I also plan on looking at festivals, like the Monte-Carlo Television Festival, with the competition for its prestigious Golden Nymph Award..

When it comes to marketing, I strongly believe that the characters are key. Promotional images will be based around each news crew member. I'm also interested in the idea of immersive marketing using social media, having accounts on platforms such as Twitter set up, seemingly run by the characters, bringing the show forward even if it's not on air.

Covid-19 Risk Assessment Checklist

Try to use this risk assessment as early in the production process as possible. There is little point in leaving it until later, only to find that the risks of your production make it untenable to actually produce.

We have prepared a checklist below to help identify key issues you need to work through with your production team and/or a relevant member of the teaching/academic staff.

We anticipate that, after this assessment, some of you may decide that filming now is not practical or affordable. Reducing risks can have significant cost implications, which, in a student production, can be a major issue.

If you find yourself in that situation, you may need to postpone, adapt your idea or find a new one, or try alternative methods of production, such as remote filming.

The template below is a basic Covid-19 risk assessment checklist that, we hope, you can apply to any production, whatever the format, genre or size, to help you address the filming challenges that the Covid-19 pandemic presents. Please remember, however, that these considerations are not exclusive nor definitive. You should always check the latest advice from IADT, as well as local/national government advice. If you plan to travel or film outside Ireland, you will need to check country-specific laws and guidance. You may also, with advice and input from relevant members of the teaching/technical/support staff, identify other issues that could/should be on your checklist.

Please note: This Checklist was inspired by The Documentary Society Checklist for documentary filmmaking.

Dublin City Council has no objection to your filming as proposed above, subject to the following conditions:

General conditions

- Filmmakers must ensure that Dublin City Council (DCC) is kept fully informed of the intentions of the production company.
- Productions should nominate a member of crew to liaise with the relevant agencies and services, that person should be an experienced Location Manager or Unit Production Manager, where possible.
- · Filming to take place at the stated locations, dates and times only.
- Filming in progress signs should be used with the signs clearly posted in public view. The notice should be large enough that those passing by will clearly see it.
- Dublin City Council must be credited in the production titles for their assistance in the making of the programme/film/series and the DCC logo included where possible. Please contact Dublin City Council's Events Team for the Council Logo in various formats or download them from <u>www.dublincity.ie/filming</u>
- This decision notice does not apply to Grand Canal Square or Henrietta Street or Council owned Parkland.
- This decision notice does not permit you to film outside Department of Justice properties, Department of Defence properties, any national embassies, any national consulate offices, or airports.
